Suggestions for Math Courses and Possible Pathways in Secondary Mathematics

MOVING FROM MFM1P TO MPM2D

To move from MFM1P to MPM2D, students must take a mandatory summer transfer course. This is a .5 credit course and runs for ½ day in July. It is also recommended that students receive a year-end mark in MFM1P of 85% or higher to be successful. Please discuss this move with your Math teacher and a Guidance Counsellor.

MOVING FROM MFM2P TO MCF3M

In order to be successful, the Riverdale Math Department recommends that a student should have a minimum mark of 80% in Grade 10 Applied Math.

Grade 9 Students can take *one* Grade 11 Course in Grade 10. More info can be found in the Business and Canadian and World Studies Info sheets in **Resources** section of www.myBlueprint.ca. Students may select one of the following courses:




1) ADD COURSES FOR NEXT YEAR
