


National Student Loan Data System (NSLDS) — Student Access

The National Student Loan Data System (NSLDS) is the U.S. Department of Education's central database for Title IV federal student aid. Your NSLDS records are comprised of student loans and/or grant amounts, outstanding balances, loan statuses, disbursements and enrollment information from postsecondary schools, guarantors, the Direct Loan program, and other Title IV financial aid participating organizations. Non-Title IV loans such as private student loans are not included in your total. You must contact your private loan holder for terms and conditions.

If you're uncertain about your federal student aid amounts or loan holders, check your student records on NSLDS at <https://nslds.ed.gov> 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. It's important to know who and what you owe.

Retrieve Your Loan Information

The National Student Loan Data System (NSLDS) is the U.S. Department of Education's (ED's) central database for student aid. NSLDS receives data from schools, guaranty agencies, the Direct Loan program, and other Department of ED programs. NSLDS Student Access provides a centralized, integrated view of Title IV loans and grants so that recipients of Title IV Aid can access and inquire about their Title IV loans and/or grant data.

To access your NSLDS records, you'll need to provide your FSA ID. If you don't have an FSA ID, you can register for one at <https://fsaid.ed.gov>. Parents may review their PLUS loan information by entering the website using their personal identifiers and their own PIN.
