



## 7th and 8th GRADE ONLINE REGISTRATION

2018-2019

Students will register for classes the week of February 5<sup>th</sup> through science classes. Students will sign up for the following classes.

### **ONLINE REGISTRATION**

- Students will register online using **Skyward Student Access**.
- After your child registers, you can ask him/her to login and show you the classes they selected.
- Changes can be made until **February 23**<sup>rd</sup>.
- Parents cannot see or make changes to students course selections using Skyward Family Access.
- If your child does not know his/her **Skyward** Login, please ask him/her see their counselor for help. We encourage all of our students to use their **Skyward Student Access** to monitor their grades.



(Integrated Physics and Chemistry)

Students must take an IPC exam to test out of 8<sup>th</sup> grade Science TEKS and be enrolled in Alg. I. IPC is considered a high school <u>elective</u>. Students will not receive a high school science credit for this course. All students will register for Science 8 and we will change them into IPC if they qualify. The test for IPC will be on April 24th (early release).

## Science Classes

### **8th Grade Science Opportunities**



All students enrolled in 7th grade will be provided an opportunity to take an IPC Screener assessment. This assessment will also be given on April 24<sup>th</sup> at Hill Country MS from 2:15-4:15 pm.

Pre-Requisite: Concurrent enrollment or prior completion of Algebra I

### 7<sup>th</sup> Grade

- Texas History 7
- Texas History 7GT

Students must be in GT to sign up for this course.

### 8<sup>th</sup> Grade

- American History 8
- American History 8 GT

Students must be in GT to sign up for this course.

## History Classes

### 7th Grade English

- English 7
- English 7 Pre-AP

Students can sign up for either course. Keep in mind that the Pre-AP course will move at a faster pace and will require higher-level critical thinking skills.

### 8th Grade English

- English 8
- English 8 Pre-AP

Students can sign up for either course. Keep in mind that the Pre-AP course will move at a faster pace and will require higher-level critical thinking skills.




### Students currently enrolled in ...

- Math 6 will be placed into Math 7
- Math 6/7 and Math 7 will be placed into Math 8
- Math 7 Pre-AP will be placed into Math 8 Pre-AP.
- Math 8 will be placed into Algebra I
- Math 8 Pre-AP will be placed into Algebra I Pre-AP
- Algebra I Pre-AP will be placed into Geometry Pre-AP

\*\*Math Models does not satisfy the admission requirements of most four-year universities.

Eanes ISD expects student enrollment in a math course each year of high school.

### **Credit by Exam (CBE)**

Credit by Exam provides an additional acceleration option for the very small number of students who are ready to "place out" of a math course.

- Historically, less than 10% of Eanes ISD students qualify for math acceleration each year.
- These alternative methods do not provide the foundations and depth of instruction that a full year course taken at West Ridge Middle School would provide.
- Please note that a CBE may not prepare students for the rigor and expectations for future courses taken in Eanes ISD.

### Credit by Exam (CBE)

#### Math 6

All students enrolled in Math 6 will be provided an opportunity to take a math assessment to "place out" of Math 7. This assessment will be given on April 24<sup>th</sup> at Hill Country from 2:15- 4:15 pm. Students will have two hours to complete the assessment (without a calculator) and must score an 80% or higher to be placed into Math 8 Pre-AP.

#### Math 7, Math 7 Pre-AP, or Math 6/7

All students enrolled in Math 7, Math 7 Pre-AP, or Math 6/7 will be provided an opportunity to take a math assessment to "place out" of Math 8. This assessment will also be given on April 24<sup>th</sup> at Hill Country from 2:15-4:15 pm. Students will have two hours to complete the assessment (with the use of a graphing calculator) and must score an 80% or higher to be placed into Algebra I Pre-AP.

## What does not fulfill the requirement?

- HCMS Golf
- HCMS Tennis
- HCMS Soccer

#### Why?

These sports do not fulfill the hour requirement. The season is very short and does not meet the P.E. requirement. Students cannot "sign" up for these classes through skyward.

There will be information communicated through HCTV for students that are interested in playing these sports. These are spring sports that start practicing in March after school.

### Required: One semester of Physical Education

- All P.E. waiver applications and letters with must be received by the deadline by Aug. 6<sup>th</sup> for fall and Dec. 14<sup>th</sup> for spring.
- Category 2 Waivers:

Students must complete 5 hours a week in the <u>same</u> sport. This allows students to take an extra elective.

### □ Category 1 Waivers:

Students must complete 15 hours a week in the <u>same</u> sport. This allows students to leave school an hour early (3:00) or come to school an hour late (9:15). Students <u>must leave</u> <u>campus</u> if they have a category 1 waiver.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: If my child doesn't make the volleyball or basketball team, do they drop athletics?

A: No. Students who do not make the team will stay in athletics and go into "off-season".

Q: If my child wants to play just basketball, what does he/she sign up for?

A: Your child would sign up for athletics all year and communicate to the coaches that he/she only wants basketball.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- Q: Would my child qualify for a P.E. waiver if she does two hours of dance and 3 hours of golf each week?
- A: No. Students need to be doing 5 or 15 hours of the <u>same sport</u> every week to qualify for a P.E. waiver.
- Q: Can my child sign up for two world language classes?
- A: Yes. However, we have not had many students complete both successfully.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q. Will my child have lunch with their grade level?

A. Yes

Q. If my child signs up for Pre-AP and is struggling, can they drop?

A. Yes

Q. Who will my child's counselor be next year?

A. Your child's counselor will be the same as this year.


#### Sleep deprivation

- Article from Stanford Medicine calls it an "epidemic"




# Resiliency & Growth Mindset
