3 Delivery Methods

Online

ce.mohawkcollege.ca/online

Online learning courses provide you with the opportunity to learn online, anywhere, and at your convenience. Most courses are delivered every January, May and September. There are also many monthly intake course offerings. Courses are delivered over a 14-week period and are led by instructors. They are not self-paced or self-directed. There are scheduled start and end dates and you cannot start late or finish early.

The delivery method is identified in the course listings as OntarioLearn or eLearn. Your start-up information is different depending on the delivery. See below.



Fuel Certification Challenge Examinations

Challenge Examinations for all Gas and Oil Burner Technician Certifications may be written at the Technical Standards and Safety Authority (TSSA) 1-877-682-8772

www.tssa.org. After successful completion of the written challenge examination (minimum pass 75%), you must submit to a Practical Assessment. The TSSA will conduct the practical assessments at a location of their choice. Scheduling appointments and costs to be determined at the time of calling the TSSA.

Theoretical challenge examinations for the Oil or Gas Technician will interest those with Gas or Oil Burner Technician experience who are not certified in any category or have never possessed any Certificate of Qualification as a Gas or Oil Burner Technician. Reinstatement and higher category challenge examinations will have to be arranged and written at the TSSA.

If you wish to challenge the Gas or Oil Burner Technician II exam or the Gas and Oil Burner Technician I exam you must provide proof of the following to the TSSA:

- A valid Gas or Oil Burner Technician III or II license, depending on the exam you are challenging.
- Documentation of the hours related to the work experience for the license that you are challenging, types of equipment, etc.
- Include letters or affidavits from employers detailing work experience related to the certification sought and the name and certificate number of the supervising certificate holder(s).



Fuel Technician Certification

Gas Technician and Oil Burner Technician courses, designed to train participants for Ontario certification, are accredited by the Technical Standards and Safety Authority. Successful completion for certification requires at least 80% attendance and a minimum grade of 75% in both theory and practical for each course section.

All Fuel Certification courses/programs are endorsed and supported by Ontario Regulation 215. You must write an examination within one year of accredited course/program completion. Failure to meet the requirements within one year of completion will necessitate retraining.

Rewrites & Re-examination:

Candidates will be permitted to attempt the theoretical and practical exams a maximum of three times. A candidate who is unsuccessful in their third attempt must attend a full training program again. As per OREG 215, a candidate may apply to the TSSA, Director, Fuel Safety Division providing exceptional reasons for a fourth attempt. One is able to rewrite after thirty days of an unsuccessful attempt.

Mohawk College will advertise a rewrite schedule in the Continuing Education catalogue and on our website.

No one should fill out an application for a higher certification level until successfully completing a lower level certification.

Upon completion of all four parts of Gas Technician 2, the student will be permitted to book the final TSSA examination.

NOTE: Participants are required to pay an Examination Fee of \$230.00 for each level (GT-3, GT-2, GT-1) of certification and each attempt.



What are the Admission Requirements?

For credit courses leading to a certificate or diploma, you require a secondary school diploma or equivalent (Mohawk Academic Upgrading, GED), or you must be 19 years of age or older on the day the course starts. The college reserves the right to restrict enrollment for most general education and non-credit continuing education courses to those 19 years of age and over. Some programs have specific admission requirements which are listed in the program description.

Students living outside of Canada, who are registering for online courses, do not need approval but must register by fax or mail. International fees will apply in all cases. I'm a Senior Citizen. Is there a discount available?

Senior Citizens, 65 years of age or older, may register for most Continuing Education funded, credit courses for 50% of the seat fee, plus all other fees except the Academic Service Fee (ASF) and Student Activity Fee (SAF). Proof of age is required at registration.

How do I view my final grades?

Login to your MOCOmotion account, My Student Account tab, scroll down to My Grades and click on My Final Grades. It may take two to six weeks after the end date of your course for grades to be entered.

I lost my Certificate/Diploma - can I get a replacement?

How do I get my Income Tax Receipt (T2202A)?

In March of each year you will be able to access your T2202A Tuition and Education Amounts Certificate for the previous calendar year. 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
