- Varying levels of use requirement and allowable access




Wisconsin

- First established in 2013
- Wis. Stat. § 961.385
- WI ePDMP connected to PDMPs in 15 other states including MN, IL, MI and IN
- Nationally recognized PDMP

HOPE LEGISLATION

HOPE Legislation 2015

• *Implemented 2016/2017*

- Dispensers required to submit to the PDMP by the end of the next business day
- Expanded access for health care
- Creation of Medical Coordinator role
- Law enforcement/prosecutorial units
 - Duty to Report
 - Access without a court order
- Prescribers required to review PDMP prior to prescribing a monitored prescription drug

Exceptions to Review

Review PDMP before the practitioner issues a prescription order for the patient unless:

- The patient is receiving hospice care.
- Order is intended to last three days or less and is not subject to refill.
- Drug is lawfully administered to the patient.
- Due to emergency, it is not possible to review the PDMP.
- PDMP is not operational or other technological failure.




Dispensing Data Overview

- If licensed in WI, must submit daily to PDMP or request waiver
- 5 days to correct records that failed to load due to errors
- Approximately 2,000 pharmacies submitting
- Average of 700,000 records per month



Dispensing Trends: Show a Trend Down



2015-2018 Trend by Drug Class

- Opioids: 29% decrease (1.5 million fewer prescriptions)
- Benzodiazepines: 19% decrease (445,000 fewer prescriptions)
- Stimulants: 6% increase (in 2016, then minimal change)

The ePDMP is a new tool to help combat the ongoing prescription drug abuse epidemic in Wisconsin. By providing valuable information about controlled substance prescriptions that are dispensed in the state, it aids healthcare professionals in their prescribing and dispensing decisions. The ePDMP also fosters the ability of pharmacies, healthcare professionals, law enforcement agencies, and public health officials to work together to reduce the misuse, abuse, and diversion of prescribed controlled substance medications.

- Once request is approved, direct access is granted within the PDMP

Total Opioid Daily Dose and Opioid-Benzodiazepine Concurrence for the Past 100 Days

According to the CDC, calculating the total daily dose of opioids helps identify patients who may benefit from measures to reduce risk of overdose. Concur of benzodiazepines and opioids can place an individual at an increased risk for severe respiratory distress that can lead to overdose death. On the chart below indicates the patient's cumulative daily dose of opioids and the red shading indicates when the patient had concurrent opioid and benzodiazepine prescriptions.

The total daily dose of opioids is calculated using the morphine milligram equivalent (MME) conversion values from the national Prescription Drug Monitoring Program Training and Technical Assistance Center at Brandeis University. The federal centers for disease control and prevention provides more information about the importance of MME calculations in calculating total daily dose.

 Federally Funded Opioid Treatment
 Programs do not report dispensing data
 to PDMPs due to federal regulations.

Concurrent use of benzodiazepines and opioids can place an individual at an increased risk for severe respiratory distress that can lead to overdose death. On the chart below, the line indicates the patient's cumulative daily dose of opioids and the red shading indicates when the patient had concurrent opioid and benzodiazepine prescriptions.



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DATA DRIVEN ALERTS

WI ePDMP uses sophisticated data analytics to assess a patient's controlled substance prescription history

1. Multiple Prescribers or Pharmacies
5 or more in the last 90 days
2. High Current Daily Dose of Opioids
Exceeds 90 morphine milligram equivalent (MME)
3. Concurrent Benzodiazepine and Opioid
Active prescriptions for both drugs
4. Long-Term Opioid Therapy with Multiple Prescribers
1 opioid or more from 2 or more prescribers for more than 90 days
5. Multiple Same Day Prescriptions
Same controlled substance drug from multiple prescribers or pharmacies on the same day
6. Early Refill
Filled 2 or more days earlier than expected





The Controlled Substances Board is created in Wis. Stat. § 15.405(5g) and has authority as outlined in Wis. Stat. ch. 961.

Members

The members of the Controlled Substances Board are appointed as outlined in Wis. Stat. § 15.405(5g). The Board consists of 7 members with no term expiration dates: the Attorney General, the Secretary of Health Services, and the Secretary of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection, or their designees; the chairperson of the Pharmacy Examining Board, the chairperson of the Medical Examining Board, the chairperson of the Dentistry Examining Board, and the chairperson of the Board of Nursing, or a designee; and 2 members appointed by the Governor to serve 3-year terms: 1 psychiatrist member and 1 pharmacologist member.
